SAETY IN FORMATION 3/97

EQUIPMENT USED BY STUDENT PARACHUTISTS

The following was decided by the BPA Safety & Training Committee at their Meeting of the 11th December 1997:-

- 1. Parachute clubs must ensure that steering toggles fitted to main parachutes used by Student Parachutists, are of a standardised type and colour at that club.
- 2. Parachute clubs must ensure that steerable reserve parachutes that are fitted with steering toggles, used by Student Parachutists, are of a standardised type and colour at that club.
- N.B. 1 & 2 above, must be implemented by the 1st June 1998.
- 3. Any club using 'Traditional' equipment may seal the canopy release units, at the CCIs discretion. If the canopy release units are sealed, they must be done so in a manner acceptable to the STC and Riggers Committees.
 - Where canopy release units are not sealed, Student Parachutists must be taught how they are operated and the implications of their operation in the air.
- 4. CCIs must set a maximum all up weight for the parachutes used Student Parachutists jumping 'Traditional' equipment on their first descent, having considered the information provided by the canopy manufacturer and the BPA.
